- Difficulty taking notes
- Easily distracted by other sounds or visual activities in the room
- Difficulty remembering to do multiple tasks
- Difficulty paying attention
- Difficulty with reading, spelling, or both
- Missing letters when writing or copying words
- Disorganized
- Frequently loses or misplaces things
- Math skills may be below average
- May omit steps or confuse visually similar information
- Mixes up numbers when trying to do math
- Trips or bumps into things frequently
- Difficulty picking up toys and putting them away
- Unable to write legibly
- Trouble writing spelling words correctly but spells words correctly out loud

#### Auditory Processing Problems:



In order to be able to learn, your child has to be able to remember what was said. When your child has auditory processing problems, remembering can be spotty. Learning can be especially difficult because auditory processing problems affect a child's ability to remember information.

#### Visual Processing Problems:



Visual processing problems interfere with your child's ability to learn. They cause problems with organizing, learning spelling words by sight, performing math calculations, reading comprehension, missing letters when writing words, and difficulty when copying words. Children with visual processing problems can struggle to remember letters and numbers as if they have memory problems.
